Welcome all residents and visitors to Big Sky and Gallatin Canyon

<u>Meeting Place and Time:</u> Big Sky Hikers meet each Thursday morning at the Community Park located just off Little Coyote Road. Hike groups will depart at the following times, unless otherwise noted:

- Double Black Diamond (♦♦) hikes will depart at 8:00.
- Black Diamond (♦) and Blue Square (■) hikes will depart at 8:30
- Green Circle (•) hikes will depart at 9:00

Please gather at the Community Park at least 15 minutes earlier, sign up for the hike, meet your group and help prepare for a prompt departure. Transportation to the trailhead will be organized by car-pooling in each group. Roads to some trailheads will require four wheel drive vehicles with adequate ground clearance.

<u>Multiple Hike Groups:</u> To better accommodate larger numbers of hikers and differing abilities, multiple hikes have been scheduled for every Thursday. Each hike group will go to a different trailhead. At the meeting place, hikers will sign a roster/waiver sheet for each hike. Of course, all hikes are subject to change due to weather or trail conditions.

Hike Rating System: None of our hikes require technical climbing techniques or gear. HOWEVER, ALL REQUIRE THAT YOU ARE ACCLIMATED TO OUR ALTITUDE. IF YOU JUST ARRIVED FROM THE FLATLANDS, PLEASE TAKE TIME TO ENJOY OUR BEAUTIFUL AREA AND JOIN US FOR NEXT WEEK'S HIKE. Double Black Diamond (**) hikes are strenuous, involving long distances and significant altitude gain; these hikes are best suited to fit, altitude-acclimated and well-prepared hikers. Black Diamond (*) hikes are a bit less strenuous, but still significant efforts. Blue Square (*) hikes are modestly more challenging than the Green Circle (*) hikes. Green Circle (*) hikes are easiest, and suitable for hikers of all capabilities. The information provided for each hike in the table below is representative, but approximate. If you have any questions regarding the details of a particular hike, call one of the assigned leaders who will have recent, personal experience in hiking that trail.


Donation: A donation of \$2/person is asked from each hiker when signing up for hikes. This pays for administration costs (paper, postage, park fees), hike supplies (coolers, first aid kits), after hike refreshments, and donations to relevant causes or organizations.

<u>Hiking Etiquette:</u> Remember the policy of "Pack it in, pack it out," and "Leave no trace" when hiking in the wilderness or YNP. No pets or children under 12, please. *Our policy is to keep our groups together on the trail, taking occasional breaks to allow the entire group to regroup.* Your cooperation is essential, so please *DO NOT LEAVE THE GROUP AT ANY TIME*. This policy not only ensures that no one becomes separated or lost, but also is the single best way to avoid surprising a bear. *Big Sky country is grizzly bear country*, and this reality is a serious consideration on all of our hikes. *Please stay together!*

Equipment: Experienced hikers carry a well-sorted daypack, with plenty of water, lunch and snacks, rain gear and other clothing layers to cope with the abrupt changes in weather that are typical in the mountains. Sturdy (and broken in!) shoes are suggested, as many of the trails are rocky, may cross patches of snow and streams, and at times the footing can be unstable. Hike leaders will have a basic first aid kit. Hikers should bring their own bear spray, insect repellant, toilet paper, sunscreen, a map and big SMILES!! If you have questions regarding gear, ask a hike leader. Note the Ten Essentials on the tag below.

<u>Hiker Responsibilities:</u> Hike leaders are not paid guides. All hikers are responsible for their own safety – they must have the equipment, skill level and physical fitness to complete the hike, even with the unexpected challenges the mountains can throw at us. Plans may need to be adjusted for weather, sickness, injury or other unexpected events. Most of our hikes are out of cell phone coverage, so any rescue will take considerable time, and may possibly mean spending the night. Note the tag below.



All hikers should protect the forest resources by carrying out all trash, including toilet paper. Use existing trails when possible to prevent erosion. Pets and firearms are prohibited on all hikes.

NOTE: Two leaders (leader, sweeper) are required on each hike. If an assigned leader is unable to lead a hike, that person is responsible to find an appropriate substitute. Assigned leaders are also responsible to scout their hikes in advance. Based on their scouting, hike destinations may be changed at the leaders' discretion. Wildfires, road maintenance delays, weather and trail conditions are all possibilities that may make this happen!
